MEMORY AID Guidelines



What is a Memory Aid Sheet?

A Memory Aid Sheet is a <u>tool to trigger information</u> that the student has studied but may have difficulty recalling due to processing difficulties with memory, which is noted on their IEP under Assessment Accommodations.

What is Allowed on the Memory Aid:

- ✓ Formulas
- ✓ Diagrams--- not labelled
- ✓ Graphic organizers, for example mind maps, flow charts
- ✓ Examples; Sample problems
- ✓ Abbreviations; pictures; doodles; symbols
- ✓ Definitions* which are shortened or coded, with teacher's permission
- ✓ Mnemonics or Acronyms
- ✓ Key words or terms
- ✓ Notes that help memory recall; includes only information that is difficult to remember

What is Not Allowed on or Considered as a Memory Aid:

- X Teacher created memory aids
- Rages taken directly from notebook
- **☒** Handouts
- Review sheets; old quizzes/tests
- ▼ Complete definitions*

Please Note:

Be mindful of test design with respect to definitions. IEP students have access to a dictionary function on some Assistive Technology programs.

Memory Aids:

- MUST BE COMPLETE and SIGNED BY TEACHER at least a day before the test
- Can be typed (12 pt font) or handwritten
- 1 page; double-sided [template provided by Academic Resource Department]
- CANNOT be photocopied
- Will be stapled to completed test
