Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) Information Update 2024-2025

Administration Dates

- Fall Session November 5 December 3, 2024
- •Spring Session March 18- April 15, 2025
- Grade 10 students will write in the semester they have been assigned English.

Test Materials


•Two online test booklets. The OSSLT is completed fully online at school on the specified date.

Duration

- •185 mins. of testing time in total.
- Pre-test instructions (15 mins.) Session A (65 mins.) Break (15 mins.) Session B (75 mins.) Exit survey (15 mins.)
- All students are allotted double time if required.

Results

•An Individual Student Report indicating whether you are successful or unsuccessful will be received either in the end of January or the end of June depending on when a student attempts the test.



FAQS:

- All Grade 10 students must write the OSSLT at least one time. If unsuccessful, students
 must successfully complete the equivalent Ontario Literacy Course (OLC). It is a
 graduate requitement.
- Grade 10 students will write with their English classes either in semester 1 or 2, depending on when they are scheduled to take English.
- All students will be completing the test in the d'Youville Library on their scheduled date beginning right after the morning announcements. Please be prompt and in full uniform!
- Students with an Individual Education Plan (IEP) will not write with their classes. These students will write on an alternative date because they are offered different accommodations in accordance with their IEP. Mrs. Andreacola (Teacher-Librarian) will inform them of the date they will be writing.
- The passing grade for the OSSLT is 300 out of 400.
- Students are required to complete all four activities in each session for a total of eight activities between Sessions A and B. Do not leave any blanks! If you are unsure, make an educated guess. You have a 1 in 4 chance of getting the non-written response questions correct!
